**STOP WORK NOTICE**

*For Violation(s) of the  
Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Ordinance  
(Chapter 248 of the Cecil County Code)*

Whereas, Violations of Chapter 248 (Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Ordinance) have been found at the above premises, it is hereby ordered in accordance with the above Code that all persons cease, desist from, and STOP WORK at once pertaining to all construction or grading alterations on the above premise, except that work which is necessary for correction of the violations listed below.

Any violation of Chapter 248 shall be deemed a misdemeanor, and the person, partnership or corporation who is found guilty of such violation in a court of competent jurisdiction shall be subject to a fine not exceeding five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00), or one (1) year of imprisonment for each and every violation. Failure to comply with this stop work notice shall be deemed justification for cancellation of the permit. No additional site work shall proceed until the Department of Public Works inspects and approves the remedial repairs contained in the stop work order. Under no circumstances whatsoever shall verbal permission, given at any time by any person, be considered as a justification for any work to be accomplished or any deviation from approved plans to be made which violates any of these regulations.

In order to release the stop work order, the following violations must be **immediately** addressed by completing all required corrective actions.

**Nature of Violation(s):**

- 3A** Failure to obtain a grading permit.
- 6B** Failure to comply with provisions of the approved erosion and sediment control plan.
- 7A** Failure to obtain an erosion and sediment control plan.
- 7E** Approved erosion and sediment control plan has expired.
- 11A** Work performed does not conform to the provisions of the grading permit.
- 11B** Work performed does not conform to the specifications of the approved erosion and sediment control plan.
- 11C** Failure to obtain an approved erosion and sediment control plan.
- 14** Grading permit has expired.
- 18B** Violation(s) persist after the date specified for corrective action on the Notice of Violation dated [Click here to enter a date..](#)

**Corrective Action(s) Required:**

- Install silt fence or super silt fence per specifications shown on the approved plan.
- Install the stone construction entrance per the specification shown on the approved plan.
- Existing perimeter erosion and sediment controls must be inspected and maintained throughout the site.
- Move all debris inside the Limits of Disturbance (as delineated on the approved plan).
- Stabilize all disturbed areas outside the Limits of Disturbance.
- Obtain a valid grading permit.
- Contact the Cecil Soil Conservation District at 410.398.4411, x – 3 to obtain or renew an erosion and sediment control plan for the site.
- Contact the Plans Review Section of the Department of Public Works at (410)996-5265 to obtain a stormwater management plan.
- All disturbed areas must be stabilized with 4" of topsoil, seeded, strawed and anchored per the specifications shown on the approved erosion and sediment control plan.
- Other: Contact the Maryland Department of the Environment compliance section @ (410-901-4020) to determine what state permits are required

Upon correction of the violation(s) above, it is the responsibility of the permit applicant to contact the Sediment & Stormwater Branch inspector for a re-inspection of the site to request a release of the stop work order. The site listed above must be in complete compliance with Chapter 248 of the Cecil County Code and all applicable fees must be paid prior to release of the stop work order.

After the stop work order is issued, the Department of Public Works shall inspect the site as deemed necessary by the inspector until the stop work order is released. A re-instatement fee of \$125.00 will be required to release the stop work order. In addition to the re-instatement fee, a re-inspection fee of \$50.00 will be assessed for each and every inspection conducted during the stop work period to determine if violations have been satisfactorily addressed. Payment of re-instatement and re-inspection fee(s) related to the issuance of a stop work order will be required prior to the release of the stop work order.

**STOP WORK NOTICE**

*For Violation(s) of the  
Stormwater Management Ordinance  
(Chapter 251 of the Cecil County Code)*

Whereas, Violations of Chapter 251 (Stormwater Management Ordinance) have been found at the above premises, it is hereby ordered in accordance with the above Code that all persons cease, desist from, and STOP WORK at once pertaining to all construction or grading alterations on the above premise, except that work which is necessary for correction of the violations listed below. Failure to correct the violations listed below may result in a legal referral.

Any violation of Chapter 251 shall be deemed a misdemeanor, and the person, partnership or corporation who is found guilty of such violation in a court of competent jurisdiction shall be subject to a fine not exceeding five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00), or one (1) year of imprisonment for each and every violation. Failure to comply with this stop work notice shall be deemed justification for cancellation of the permit. No additional site work shall proceed until the Department of Public Works inspects and approves the remedial repairs contained in the stop work order. Under no circumstances whatsoever shall verbal permission, given at any time by any person, be considered as a justification for any work to be accomplished or any deviation from approved plans to be made which violates any of these regulations.

In order to release the stop work order, the following violations must be **immediately** addressed by completing all required corrective actions.



**Nature of Violation(s):**

- 4 Failure to provide stormwater management measures.
- 28 A (2a) Failure to begin corrective actions identified in a notice of violation within 48 hours.
- 28 A (2b) Failure to complete corrective actions identified in a notice of violation within 96 hours.
- 28 A (2c) Construction which is not in accordance with the approved stormwater management plan.
- 28 A (2d) Any violation(s) of the conditions of the stormwater management plan approval.
- 28 A (2e) Failure to adhere to the sequence of construction contained on the approved stormwater management and/or erosion and sediment control plan.
- 28 A (2f) Failure to adhere to the requirements contained in Section 251-20 (Inspection Access and Site Safety).
  - 20A Unreasonable delays in allowing access to the site and/or reasonable access to the site was denied.
  - 20C Failure to provide appropriate measures to ensure the safety of contractor employees, County personnel and the public.
- 28 A (2g) Failure to adhere to the requirements contained in Section 251-21(Inspection Schedule and Reports).
  - 21A Failure to hold a preconstruction meeting with the Sediment & Stormwater Branch of the Department of Public Works.
  - 21B Materials and/or methods of construction of the stormwater management measure(s) is not in accordance with the approved plan.
  - 21C Failure of the developers authorized representative to submit weekly inspection reports and/or to submit inspection reports following each inspection stage specified in Section 251-22 (A) during construction of stormwater management systems.
- 28 A (2h) Failure to adhere to the requirements contained in Section 251-22 (Inspection Requirements During Construction).
  - 22A Failure of the developer or their authorized representative to notify the Department of Public Works inspector when "specified stages" (as defined in Section 251-22A) of construction have occurred and/or failure to have a qualified representative present during the construction of these "specified stages".
- 28 A (2i) A violation is of an immediate and serious nature, as determined by the Department of Public Works.

**Corrective Action(s) Required:**

- Contact the Plans Review Section of the Department of Public works at 410-996-5265 to obtain, revise or modify approved stormwater management plans.
- Conduct a preconstruction meeting with a representative of the Sediment & Stormwater Branch prior to any additional work occurring on stormwater management measures.
- Install and/or maintain erosion and sediment control best management practices required during the construction of stormwater management measures.
- Remove any temporary or permanent obstruction that prohibits safe and easy access to the site.
- Provide all necessary safety measures to be in compliance with OSHA construction industry standards and regulations.
- Provide all required inspections reports related to the construction of the stormwater management measures.
- Ensure that a qualified representative is present at all times during the "specified stages" of construction of all stormwater management measures.
- Remove all material(s) and/or components of the stormwater management measures which were not constructed and/or installed in accordance with the approved plan.
- Install all components of the stormwater management measure(s) in accordance with the approved plan.
- All disturbed areas must be stabilized with 4" of topsoil, seeded, strawed and anchored per the specifications shown on the approved erosion and sediment control plan.

Upon correction of the violation(s) above, it is the responsibility of the permit applicant to contact the Sediment & Stormwater Branch inspector for a re-inspection of the site to request a release of the stop work order. The site listed above must be completely in compliance with Chapter 251 of the Cecil County Code before a stop work order is released. No additional site work shall proceed until the Department of Public Works inspects and approves the remedial repairs contained in this Stop Work Notice. The Department of Public Works shall also inspect the site as deemed necessary after issuance of a stop work order until the stop work order is released. A re-instatement fee of \$125.00 will be required to release a stop work order. In addition to the re-instatement fee, a re-inspection fee of \$50.00 will be assessed for each and every inspection conducted during the stop work period to determine if violations have been satisfactorily addressed. Payment of re-instatement and re-inspection fee(s) related to the issuance of a stop work order will be required prior to the release of the stop work order.
